- (1) Man's guilt. (Rom. 3:9-10, 23)
- (2) God's righteousness. (**Rom.** 3:24-26)
- (3) God's power to save. (**Rom.** 1:16; 8:3)
- (4) God's gracious offer. (**Jno. 3:16; Tit. 2:11**)
- (5) God's love. (**Rom. 5:8; Jno. 3:16**)
- (6) Necessity of man's obedience. (Phil. 2:8; Heb. 5:8-9)
- (7) To assure Christians that cleansing is available. (1 Jno. 1:7-10)
- (8) Shows the worth of the church. (Acts 20:28; Eph. 5:25)
- (9) The need for holy living. (1 Cor. 6:18-20; 1 Pet. 1:15)
- (10) The need for humility. (**Phil.** 2:5-8)

Christ came to earth to do the will of His Father. He willingly endured the persecution and pain that wicked man brought upon Him. He humbly obeyed God, and died on the cross for the sins of mankind. Looking at what the cross teaches should cause us to gladly and willingly give up anything that stands between us and God. It should result in an attitude of commitment and dedication like we have never seen. It should motivate one to be restored. It should cause one to become a Christian.
