We have a problem. We have too many givers. We would be better off if we did not have so many.

There are too many who GIVE UP! They serve Christ for a while, but then just quit. At one time they attended faithfully all of the services of the church, but they have started dropping by the wayside. They need to remember that Jesus said. "No man having put his hands to the plow and looking back is fit for the kingdom of God" (Lk. 9:62). The easiest thing in the world is just to quit. Remember that the reward comes after endurance. Don't quit!

There are too many who GIVE OVER! They become guilty of the sin of compromise. They frantically try to please men rather than God. Let us each resolve not to GIVE UP. GIVE OVER. GIVE IN OR GIVE OUT!

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One Dies Before Baptism Jimmy Pettigrew

If someone has accepted the Lord Jesus in repentance. and dies before baptism, is he saved? The truth is that no one can "accept the Lord Jesus" without baptism, for it was the Lord who put baptism into the gospel and reguired it of all who would come to Him.

Christ doesn't give us options about how to accept Him. Please notice these passages: Redemption is found in Christ (Romans 3:24); There is no condemnation to them Can you please answer these questions? Is one in Christ which are in Christ (Romans 8:1): The love of God is found before baptism (Romans 6:3)? Are sins washed away bein Christ (Romans 8:39). We are sanctified in Christ (1 fore baptism (Acts 22:16)? Is one saved before baptism Corinthians 1:2); In Christ shall all be made alive (1 Corin- (Mark 16:16)? Is one in the kingdom before baptism (John thians 15:22): We are new creatures in Christ (2 Corin- 3:5)? The truth is that until one is baptized into Christ (Romans 6:3), he is not in Christ. Until one believes and is baptized, he is not saved (Mark 16:16). Until one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God (John 3:5). Baptism washes away sins (Acts 22:16). And until one is baptized into Christ, into his death (Romans 6:3), his sins have not been washed away.

Jesus answered, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God." - John 3:5

These passages show the Lord's purpose for baptism.

The truth is that no one can accept the Lord Jesus within Christ (Galatians 3:26-27); All blessings are found in out baptism, for it was the Lord who put baptism into the Christ (Ephesians 1:3): We are made to sit together in gospel and required it of ALL who would come to Him.
