Acts 18:24-25 states, "Now a certain Jew named Apollos...came to Ephesus...and being fervent in spirit, he spoke and taught ac-The King James Version translates this phrase as curately the things of the Lord..." Fervor and enthusiasm are the keys to success in the Lord's work. The church at Laodicea was chastised because of their lukewarmness (Rev. 3:14-16). Barclay says, God's people in the Old Testament were warned "The one man whom the Risen Christ could not stand was against having such an attitude. Amos 6:1 pronounced the man who was neither hot nor cold" (Ibid.). He added, "The Christian may burn out, but he cannot rust out."

Sadly, though, this spirit is lacking in some who claim to be God's people.
