### "Fervent in Spirit"

The word translated "fervent in spirit" means to boil with heat, be hot. It is used of boiling anger, love and zeal for what is good or bad. As used in our text, it means to have a burning zeal to do the will of God.

An example of this attitude is Jesus Christ. John 2:17. lent. William Barclay stated, "There is a certain intensity in in speaking of Him, says, "Then His disciples remembered the Christian life. Fervor and enthusiasm are the keys to success in the Lord's work. The church at Laodicea was chastised because of their lukewarmness (Rev. 3:14-16). Barclay says, "The one man whom the Risen Christ could not stand was abound in diligence (2 Cor. 8:7); and to be diligent, never the man who was neither hot nor cold" (Ibid.). He added. "The Christian may burn out, but he cannot rust out."

Sadly, though, this spirit is lacking in some who claim to commitment to the Lord was demonstrated by doing what be God's people. There are those who put off, sidestep,

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
