# **Did Judas Fall?** By Jimmy Pettigrew

Judas is a prime example of a believer who fell into complete apostasy. "And when it was day, he called his disciples: and he chose from them twelve, whom also he named apostles: Simon, whom he also named Peter, and Andrew his brother, and James and John, and Philip and Bartholomew, and Matthew and Thomas, and James (the son) of Alphaeus, and Simon who was called the Zealot, and Judas (the son) of James, and Judas Iscariot, who became a traitor" (Luke 6:13-16).

are informed that he already was a "disciple." Furthermore, he was "called" and "chosen" by Christ Himself to be an "apostle" at the same time as the other twelve. "Jesus answered them, Did not I choose you the twelve, and one of you is a devil? Now he spake of Judas (the son) of Simon Iscariot, for he it was that should betray him, (being) one of the twelve" (John 6:70-71). Going back to verse 16, chapter 6 of Luke, please note that Judas "became" a traitor. The word "became" for Judas suggests a change for the worse that occurred sometime after he was chosen as a disciple by Christ to be His apostle. Or we might say he was once a "disciple" of the Lord's elevated to apostle, who later "became a traitor," as God's Word has so stated. Either way, the spiritual condition of this apostle backslides to the place where he betrayed Christ, committed suicide and then went to the place of torment!

It is obvious that the Apostle Judas Iscariot went to the preach, heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those havplace of torment after betraying Jesus and committing ing leprosy and drive out demons. "But go rather to the suicide: "For the Son of man goeth, even as it is written of lost sheep of the house of Israel. And as ye go, preach, him: but woe unto that man through whom the Son of saying, The kingdom of heaven is at hand. Heal the sick, man is betrayed! good were it for that man if he had not raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons: been born" (Mark 14:21). This states that the twelve, including who? Judas, were given spiritual authority by Jesus to Drive out demons (Matthew 12:26)! For a person to indirectly say Judas was never saved is to say that Jesus chose Judas, who was unholy, to be His holy representative (John 6:70-71)! The Bible tells us that, "Judas by transgression fell." (Acts 1:25).

"Yea, mine own familiar friend, in whom I trusted, who did eat of my bread, hath lifted up his heel against Please note: The first time we hear of Judas Iscariot, we me" (Psalm 41:9). Jesus quotes from Psalm 41 and attributes it to Judas in John 13, verse eighteen, "I speak not of you all: I know whom I have chosen: but that the scripture may be fulfilled: He that eateth my bread lifted up his heel against me." Please note that Judas was once Jesus' close friend, whom Jesus trusted! Question: Since Jesus knew what was in man, "for he himself knew what was in man" (John 2:25), how then could Jesus trust Judas in the early days of their friendship if Judas was never saved? "Jesus saith to him. He that is bathed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit: and ye are clean, but not all. For he knew him that should betray him; therefore said he, Ye are not all clean" (John 13:10-11). Judas was not "clean" in contrast to the other disciples. But does this say that Judas was never "clean"? It merely says, at that point in time, Judas wasn't clean then! Remember, he was a disciple in the beginning, chosen to be an apostle, so he must have been clean at the beginning!

Also, remember this about Judas: he was sent forth to
