Often we find folks who justify their sinful behavior by and refuse to repent, it places a burden upon the church. saying, "I am not bothering anyone." Sin separates us from God (Isa. 59:1-2), and sin results in spiritual death (Jas. 1:15; Rom. 6:23)! Knowing that this is the case, who can believe that man can engage in sinful activities, but "bother no one"? It's impossible!

Let's stop offering excuses for sin. Rather, let us admit our parents, placing undue worry and emotional and/or our sin, repent of it, and live as God wants us to live (Acts **17:30**; **Jn. 14:15**)!
