The Jehovah's Witnesses claim to urge upon people only the Word of God. For example, they write, "We shall let God be found true by turning our readers to his imperishable word." This sounds good: however, as we examine their theology, we shall see that this is not an honest statement of what they believe and practice at all. Actually, instead of accepting scripture only and imposing that on others, they impose their system upon the scripture and force it to comply with their teaching. Notice this quote concerning one of their booklets: "Not only do we find that people cannot see the divine plan in studying the Bible by itself, but we see also, that if anyone lays the 'Scripture Studies' aside, even after he has read them for ten years - if he then lays them aside and ignores them and goes to the Bible for ten years, our experience shows that within two years he goes into darkness; on the other hand, if he had merely read the 'Scripture Studies' with their reference and had not read a page of the Bible as such, he would be in the light at the end of the two years, because he would have the light of the scriptures."

Can there be any doubt that they do not believe in the Bible only? It has become guite clear that despite the claim of this movement to stand on the Bible alone, the real source of authority is the interpretation handed down by Watch Tower headquarters.

"All who by reason of faith in Jehovah God and in Christ Jesus dedicate themselves to do God's will and then faithfully carry out their dedication will be rewarded with everlasting life (Romans 6:23). However, that life will not be the same for all. The Bible plainly shows that some of these, that is, the 144,000, will share in heavenly glory with Christ Jesus, while others will enjoy the blessings of life down on earth (Revelation 14:1, 3; Micah 4:1-5)." Kings 5:8-14). When we study this account, we underhe trusted in his worldly knowledge, his opinions, his judgment, and his wisdom, he remained a doomed leper. Only when he surrendered his will to the will of God was he cleansed. Why can't we learn that lesson today (Rom. 15:4; I Cor. 10:11)? So long as we remain stubborn, and devising ways to do it "ourselves", we will remain sad, without God, and lost. > In truth, the ability to interpret "the word of God the way I want to and not have someone tell me I am wrong" actually requires throwing the Bible away! Why do I say this? It is because the Bible itself condemns man for his sin. This is seen from Genesis 3 to the end of the Bible! Sin, and those committing it, are consistently condemned throughout Scripture. For example, Noah "condemned the world" when he built the ark (Heb. 11:7). The condemnation came because a world of sinners refused to obey God. Therefore, those who did not get on the Ark before the Flood were drowned (I Pet. 3:20). God condemned Sodom and Gomorrah for their sin (II Pet. 2:6). In like manner. these folks were destroyed because of their sinful actions God had seen. Yes, folks were condemned for their sins consistently in the Scriptures!
